# Cherry and Cocktail Tomatoes

## GOLDEN PEARL, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ yellow cherry tomato with excellent, very sweet taste
- ▶ fruits do not crack, suitable for the harvest of single fruits
- ▶ very suitable for the resale of seedlings

## LIMETTO, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ the light green coloured cherry tomato does not only set a fresh accent in terms of colour, but also in taste, it combines a light sweetness with a fruity lemon flavour
- ▶ the ripe fruits can be recognised by their slight gloss

## APRESA, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ the orange coloured fruits on short, compact clusters are medium early maturing and weigh approx. 40 g
- ▶ fruity, mild taste, well-balanced ratio of sugar and acid

## SANSIBAR, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ the deep orange coloured fruits of this early maturing variety are firm, robust against bursting and have a very good keeping quality
- ▶ crisp texture and very aromatic
- ▶ completes the colourful assortment of mini plum tomatoes

## NUGGET, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ golden coloured mini plum tomato
- ▶ robust against blossom end rot, does not burst
- ▶ good addition in terms of colour in the snack tomato segment
- ▶ well-balanced ratio of sugar and acid

## RAVELLO, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ very early mini San Marzano type with excellent, fruity taste
- ▶ robust against bursting and blossom end rot, slender growth habit
- ▶ very suitable for the resale of seedlings

## SIDERNO, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ compact growing bush tomato with bright red, tasty fruits in cherry size
- ▶ optimally suitable for container cultivation
- ▶ abundant fruit set
- ▶ small-leaved variety with short-stalked foliage
- ▶ pictured in a 33 cm, 12 litre container

## Roma Tomatoes

### INCAS, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ very early Roma type, concentrated maturity, suitable as peeled or pureed tomatoes
- ▶ fruits are bright red, thick-fleshed and of good keeping quality
- ▶ bush type

### AGRO, F<sub>1</sub>

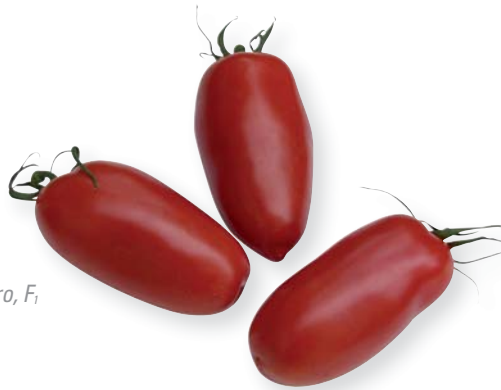
- ▶ fruits are a cylindrical-oblong San Marzano type with indeterminate growth
- ▶ can be harvested in semi-green or red maturity stage because of the long harvest period
- ▶ good shelf life



## Truss Tomato

### SERRAT, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ long life type for harvesting in clusters or as single fruits
- ▶ very good early and total yields
- ▶ very suitable for the resale of seedlings

## Round Fruits

### DIPLOM, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ very early type, homogeneously coloured with excellent taste
- ▶ high early and total yield
- ▶ vigorous and open growth



### HILDARES, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ a very early forcing and open field variety with a high yielding potential
- ▶ Hildares is a tomato without green shoulders
- ▶ very suitable for the resale of seedlings

### TOMOSA, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ early variety with short internodes
- ▶ fruits are round and uniform with 2 – 3 chambers

## Beef Tomatoes

### PINK WONDER, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ beef tomato with very uniform fruit load
- ▶ the pink-coloured tomatoes are slightly ribbed, juicy and very tasty

### COUNTRY TASTE, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ juicy beef tomato with very large, dark red fruits that are still firm when mature
- ▶ a tasty enrichment for the hobby market
- ▶ suitable for the resale of seedlings



Country Taste, F<sub>1</sub>

### HAMLET, F<sub>1</sub>

- ▶ very firm, round tomato for single fruit harvest
- ▶ well-coloured, uniform fruits
- ▶ high-yielding, indeterminate growth
- ▶ very suitable for the resale of seedlings



## Open-pollinated Varieties

### MATINA (potatoe-leaved)

- ▶ robust open field tomato, extreme early, vigorous growth
- ▶ medium-sized fruits, bright red without green shoulder














### HELLFRUCHT/HILMAR®

- ▶ robust type, high yielding, firm, uniformly coloured fruits
